YEAR 10 GIRLS GET A TASTE OF THE TRADIE LIFE



On Tuesday 21st June, the Year 10 girls visited the Mackay Christian College Trade Training Centre where they spent a fantastic day doing an initial safety induction, then an introduction on how to MIG weld followed by the making of a jewellery tree for the Women Who Weld (WWW). The program was delivered by the Gateway to Industry Schools Program (GISP) which is proudly hosted by QMI, WWW and sponsored by Cummings.

The aim was to provide an opportunity and safe environment for young women to try the practical skill of welding. This provided our students with an understanding of welding and an idea of STEAM school subjects. It's also an opportunity for the girls to decide whether a trade career pathway is something they wish to explore further. Their fabrication craftsmanship was outstanding!

'Women Who Weld' aims to address our national trade skills shortage. The program encourages young women to consider a trade pathway where 76% of jobs within Queensland's manufacturing sector are occupied by men.
