SUPERVISION AND COMMUNICATION

At Carlisle College, the safety and wellbeing of our students is our top priority. To ensure a secure environment and maintain accurate attendance records, we kindly ask all families to adhere to the following procedures.

School Access and Early Pick-Ups

During school hours, all parents must enter through the front gate and report to the school office before collecting their child early. Please note that the back gate is strictly for access before and after school hours only.

Attendance Sign-In and Sign-Out

To help us maintain precise attendance records: Students arriving after 8:38 AM must sign in at the school office.

Students leaving before 3:00 PM (Primary) or 3:10 PM (Secondary) must also sign out at the office.

For absences longer than three days, a medical certificate or exemption form is required.

Meeting with Teachers

If you wish to discuss your child's progress or raise any concerns, we encourage you to contact their teacher via email to arrange an appointment. Mornings are a busy time, and scheduling a meeting helps us provide dedicated time and attention to your child's needs.

Morning Supervision and Daily Schedule

- Morning supervision begins at 8:15 AM. Students should remain seated in the quad with their school bags until this time.
- The first bell rings at 8:38 AM, allowing students to line up and prepare for class, which starts promptly at 8:40 AM.
- The school day concludes at 3:00 PM for Primary students and 3:10 PM for Secondary students.



Well done, Jordan! We're proud of the way you represented your school, your family, and your faith, and we pray that this opportunity opens many more doors in the future.





OSHC

A Visit from Aunty Mel – Exploring Indigenous Plant Knowledge On Thursday, 10 July, we had the privilege of welcoming Aunty Mel from Younga Yarns to OSHC. Aunty Mel shared her rich knowledge of Indigenous plants and trees, beginning with a warm greeting in the language of the Yuwi people. The children were excited to return the welcome with some of the songs they've been learning.

During the session, Aunty Mel introduced us to the fascinating Xanthorrhoea, or Australian Native Grass Tree. She explained how its sap acts like super glue drying on the plant to protect it, and when heated, becoming pliable before eventually hardening like glass. We also learned about the Bloodwood tree (Corymbia opaca), whose sap has medicinal uses for treating dysentery but can have the opposite effect if taken when healthy. Another highlight was discovering the Acacia filicifolia, or Ferny-leaved Wattle, known for its sweet, edible sap that can also be transformed into a water-soluble glue.

The children were fully engaged, asking thoughtful questions and listening attentively to Aunty Mel's answers. After the talk, we moved downstairs for a hands-on activity. Each child selected an image, taped it to a sheet of hard plastic, and used black glass paint to trace the outlines. Older children were wonderful in helping younger ones with this step. Once the outlines dried, we planned to fill them in using resin stains made from the saps of the trees we had just learned about. The room was filled with excited chatter, creativity, and collaboration throughout the activity.

We are so grateful to Aunty Mel for such a meaningful and educational experience.


