At Saibai, we were greeted by children waving excitedly to meet us. After a short walk, we made it to our accommodation, where we were welcomed in by Zoey and Stella, who consistently cooked dinner for us throughout the week.

The next morning, our group assembled in the Adventist Church and organised a schedule for the week that included breakfast club, painting the church, kids club and a Saturday family program. Throughout the week, we woke up early to cook for the breakfast club, spent our mornings volunteering at the school and our afternoons painting the church before running kids club.

Our kids club ran from 4.00 to 5.30 and consisted of sport, games, songs, stories and arts and crafts. The children who attended had

an amazing time doing the activities and learning about Jesus in the process, as our theme was connection, which was about connecting with others through good fellowship and connecting with God.

Our group finished painting the church in just three days despite the fact that Mr Skinner was absent during this process.

Our group's final day on Saibai was Saturday, when we ran the Saturday family program, which included a sausage sizzle, games, experiments, drama activities, a Q&A, as well as arts and crafts. A highlight of this experience had to be meeting the community's pet saltwater crocodile, Flinders, on Friday evening. That was before a delicious dinner at the Clarks' house, which proved to solidify the connections we made.

### **AUSLAN**

Year 5 and 6 have been learning about the 100-year anniversary of the Deaflympics, currently taking place in Tokyo. The Deaflympics is a significant cultural event for the Deaf community, represented by its unique flag and featuring the colours red, yellow, blue and green, with no text. It brings together athletes from around the world to compete in various sports.

To build understanding of how these adaptations work, students watched a basketball game to observe the use of lights and flags as visual cues, and explored judo, where touch is used to signal and guide athletes. These examples helped students appreciate the diverse ways communication can be used and how this can be applied in different areas.

Inspired by the Deaflympics flag and what they learned in class, Year 5 and 6 were tasked with designing their own flags, celebrating creativity while deepening their awareness of Deaf culture and identity. Students incorporated a range of thoughtful elements into their flag designs, including lines to represent vibrations, vibrant colours to convey energy and diversity, and hand symbols to reflect communication and connection within the Deaf community. These creative choices show an understanding of the visual and cultural importance of these elements and highlight the students' growing awareness of how Deaf identity is expressed through symbolism.

Next week will be just as memorable, with a dedicated Year 6 assembly on Monday followed by a day out at the Wakepark to mark this milestone year.





We will continue offering open-ended festive experiences to encourage teamwork, imagination and joyful Christmas exploration.
















