As we close week two, and the Prep class just passing 100 days on Monday, we would like to reflect on the busy start to the term.

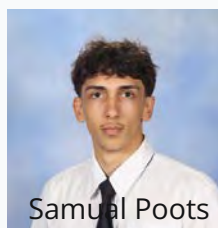

RECIPE OF THE WEEK

Cheesy Vegetable Scrolls

Looking for a simple, tasty recipe the whole family will enjoy? These cheesy vegetable scrolls are packed with flavour and make a great lunchbox option or afternoon snack.

Ingredients

- 2 sheets of puff pastry, thawed
- 1 cup grated cheese
- 1 carrot, grated
- 1 zucchini, grated and squeezed to remove excess moisture
- ½ capsicum, finely diced
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 teaspoon Italian herbs
- 1 egg, lightly beaten (for brushing)

Method

Preheat oven to 200°C and line a baking tray with baking paper. Spread tomato paste over each sheet of puff pastry. Sprinkle with grated vegetables, cheese and Italian herbs. Roll the pastry tightly into a log and slice into even scrolls. Place scrolls onto the baking tray and brush with egg. Bake for 15 to 20 minutes or until golden and cooked through.

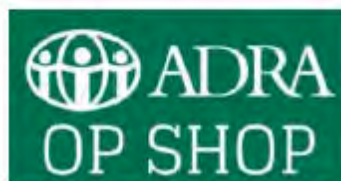
